The Congress is designed to challenge barriers and build bridges between clinicians and researchers, discuss different theoretical perspectives and traditions, integrate pharmacotherapy with psychotherapy, and include similarities and differences.

The quality and actuality of the 10 plenary presentations, the 37 symposia and clinical workshops, are exceptional.
